

Population: 1.3 billion people live in China. That is twice the number of people who live in Europe.


Capital: Beijing

See stunning countryside


- You can cruise the crystal clear rivers on bamboo rafts.

<u>Bactrian camel</u>

The camel is found across the dry deserts in Northern China. They are used to provide transport across the vast areas.

The Giant Panda

The Giant Panda roams the forests and mountains of South West China.

Siberian Tiger

This is China's top predator, also known as the Amur Tiger It lives in the cold snow-covered mountains in north-east China.
