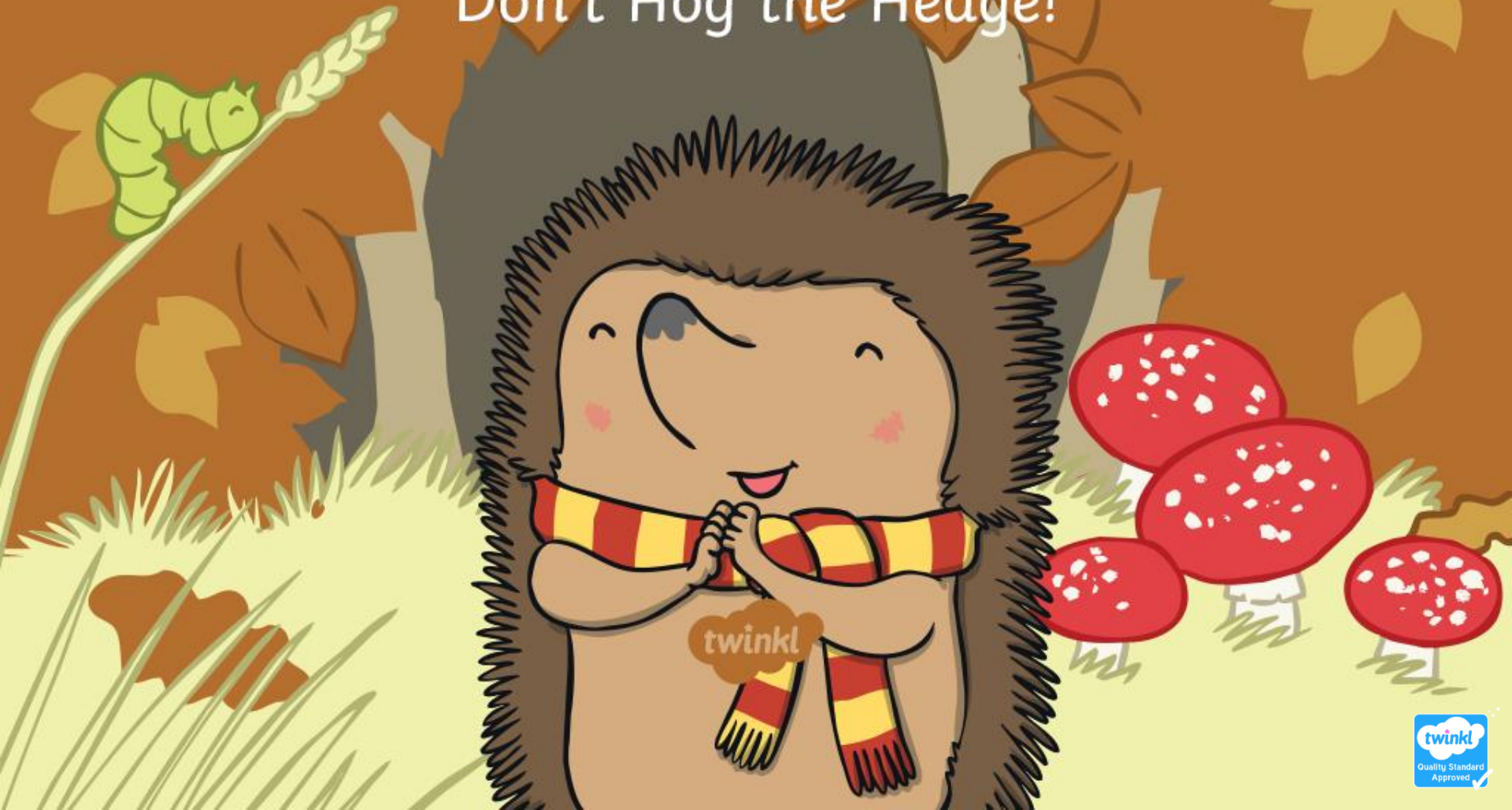

Don't Hog the Hedge!

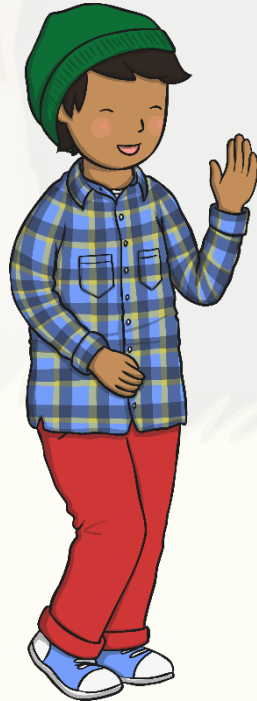


What Is Alliteration?

strong Syd

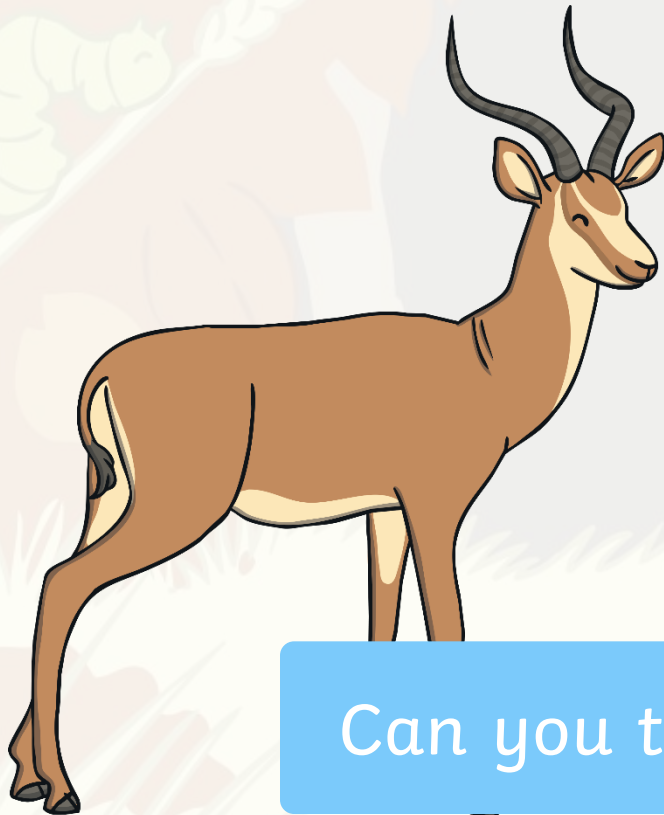
