Forgiveness is a powerfully healing force. In the Gospel this week Peter wonders how far our forgiveness should go, how many times must we be slighted before we say enough? He replies not seven, as Peter offered, but 77 times. It is in his parable he explains the story of a king settling debts with his servants. One of them who owes a huge amount begs for more time, more patience but receives something

unexpected instead: a complete remission of his debts. The now "freed" servant leaves with a whole new life available to

him. Meeting one of his fellow servants, he demands that a relatively smaller debt be given to him at once. Unable to pay, the servant is thrown in jail. Once the king hears of this behaviour, the king demands that the first servant be put in jail. Here Jesus says this is how we will be treated if we fail to forgive others—we will suffer.

HEADS UP ST SIMON

This week, St Simon explored the Solar System and why Earth revolves around the Sun. In RE, they learnt about St. Paul's letters and how they influenced us and our 7 principles of CST. St. Simon particularly enjoyed crafting dreamcatchers and designing tepees while in Maths they revised special numbers. They also enjoyed writing about Native Americans.



Along with all the other classes, we used our penny donations to decorate a red cross to remember the people working with the Red Cross charity in Libya and Morocco. We also remember those who have tragically died and suffered through those hard times.
