TALK THE TALK

The Year of the Holy Spirit



Matthew's Gospel this week reminds us how easy it is to "Talk the Talk". A father, having asked both sons to help in the vineyard is initially disappointed in his son as he says he won't do as he was asked. Then having thought upon the situation the son relents and does his father's will. The second son immediately says yes to his father but just to appease him: in fact he does nothing about it!! The message is clear. God is the father in this parable and the son who says yes represents the Pharisees who talk and flaunt their "obedience" but have no true commitment to following His ways. They outwardly conform and talk about right and wrong, but it is show with no real substance. The son who initially says no, represents

those who perhaps need more work to become Godlike, who take longer to listen to His Word. They are those whom the Pharisees see as undesirables: the sinners, tax collectors, poor and unfortunate. So we must try to be like this first son and so be judged not on own words, but our actions for indeed active obedience to Jesus' teachings is crucial.
