praise, honour, thank or just talk to Him? The second is maybe easier for us to approach, as God is visible through my neighbour. I can think about my love for others, those close to me. I can think about my attitude towards every stranger around the world who is my sister and brother. I can pray for them. Yet as Jesus says we need to remember the order in which they were given and that we can't have one without the other.
