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The Year of the Holy Spirit

TALENTS



This week's Gospel sees a rich man delegating the management of his wealth to his servants, much as investors in today's markets do. He gives five talents (a large unit of money) to the first servant, two talents to the second, and one talent to the third. Two of the servants earn 100 percent returns by trading with the funds, but the third servant hides the money in the ground and earns nothing. The rich man returns, rewards the two who made money, but severely punishes the servant who did nothing. The meaning of the parable extends far beyond financial investments. God has given each

person a wide variety of gifts, and he expects us to use those gifts in his service. It is not acceptable to put those gifts in a drawer and ignore them. Like the three servants, we do not have gifts of the same degree. The return God expects of us is commensurate with the gifts we have been given. The servant who received one talent was not condemned for failing to reach the five-talent goal; he was condemned because he did nothing with what he was given. The gifts we receive from God include skills ,abilities, education, experiences, and more. The point of the parable is that we are to use whatever we have been given for God's purposes. We need to look to our gifts, not to be afraid to grow and develop, to invest them in our lives for the good of everyone. We must be selfless not selfish with them and above all not waste them.

Any children belonging to part of the Scouting / Girl Guiding movement are welcome to wear their uniform to school on Thursday 30th November


CHRISTMAS JUMPER SWAP on Monday 11th December
