# THE PARABLE OF THE SHEEP AND GOATS



Jesus begins the parable by saying it concerns His return in glory to set up His kingdom. All those on earth at that time will be brought before the Lord, and He will separate them "as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. The sheep on Jesus' right hand are blessed by God the Father and given an inheritance. The reason is stated: "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me" The righteous will not understand: when did they see Jesus in such a pitiful condition and help Him? "The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me'"

The goats on Jesus' left hand are not so lucky. The reason is given: they had opportunity to minister to the Lord, but they did nothing. The core message of the Parable of the Sheep and Goats is that God's people will love others as themselves. Good works will result from our relationship to the Shepherd. Followers of Christ will treat others with kindness, serving them as if they were serving Christ Himself. While "goats" can indeed perform acts of kindness and charity, their hearts are not right with God, and their actions are not for the right purpose – to honour and worship God but for their own benefit/earthly reward.

# <u>ADVENT</u>

This Sunday sees the start of our new Liturgical Year. The first Sunday of Advent is the beginning of our new year in the Church. We start by preparing for the birth of Our Lord and also to contemplate our readiness for His Second Coming. It is a time of great excitement and anticipation. These four weeks see us getting ready for this wondrous celebration and in school the children will be praying; their focus being each class' Advent Wreath as we count down the days to Christ's birth in that stable in Bethlehem.
