THE FEAST OF THE EPIPHANY



The feast of the Epiphany, when the Wise men bow down, in adoration at the side of the Christ Child. It is a very special moment, as these educated Gentiles who have followed a star, are the first non- Jewish people to recognise the Messiah. They are the sign that Jesus came to save all peoples. The gifts they bring are symbolic: Gold a most precious costly item for a King; Frankincense the incense we still have in Church, a sign of a priest/teacher; Myrrh, the oil used at funerals,

to suggest this king has been born for us, to die for us. We also see that they are changed by this encounter, they decide to go home taking another path to avoid Herod, but also perhaps taking a new step in their journey to eternal rest. We too must be changed by our encounter with this Christ Child this season and pray to become ever closer to this babe whose birth has changed our lives forever.
